FOOD PANTRY RENOVATION EFFORTS

St. Joseph's food pantry recently needed some help, since their needs exceeded their storage capacity in Koch Hall. The Food Pantry Ministry sought aid in reconfiguring the Koch Hall building to better serve the needs of food pantry patrons.

The Koch Hall is pivotal to a number of organizations of which the Father Koch Council #6343 is one. Koch Council has *been dedicated* to ensuring the well being of St. Joseph's Church and its various ministries for close forty years. Because of this dedication, the Father Koch Council #6343 has been involved in *renovation and maintenance of the Koch Hall over the years*.

As a result of this involvement; it was natural for the Food Pantry ministry to reach out to the Father Koch Council #6343 for aid in this reconfiguration. Past Grand Knight Ed Viellette took ownership of the effort and interfaced with the Food Pantry as to their

storage needs. New storage areas were determined to be needed and Ed assisted in their layout and design. Once the design was agreed to Ed led a team of brother Knights in the construction and reconfiguration efforts. An additional storage area was constructed which almost doubled the available storage for use. Also a closet was constructed to hold several organizations materials.
